Nhulundu Health Service Aged Care Programs provide three service delivery options for people who are aged or people living with a disability, or their carers:

1 Home Care Packages:

This program helps people live independently in their own home for as long as they can. The Australian Government provides a subsidy to Nhulundu to deliver your package of care.

2 Commonwealth Home Support Program:

This program is an entry level home help program for older people who need some help with daily tasks to live independently at home.

What will it cost?

The Australian Government subsidises a range of aged care services in Australia.

You may be asked to make a contribution for your service, based on your individual financial circumstances. To understand the costs of aged care consult the My Aged Care website (www.myagedcare.gov.au) to view interactive calculators and fact sheets. The funding program or package through which you access aged care services at home will determine how much you will need to pay. Fees and eligibility for subsidy will be discussed with you before you receive the relevant services.

There's other services too; like personal care, domestic assistance, respite, yard maintenance, and if we require medical aids, this too can be arranged with an assessment.
