

Our Services

Nhulundu Health Service Aged Care Programme provide four service delivery options for aged people or those living with a disability, or their carers:

1 Home Care Packages

This package helps people live independently in their own home for as long as they can.

2 Commonwealth Home Support Programme

This home help programme provides assistance with daily tasks for older people living independently at home. Assistance by referral can include:

- Personal care
- Domestic assistance
- Transport
- Shopping
- Social support
- Yard maintenance
- In-home meal preparation
- Allied health

3 Community Transport Programme

This programme helps clients to maintain their independence by providing access to their community for social and recreational activities including shopping and banking, access to various medical and specialists' service, essential services, or access to work.

4 Assistance with Care & Housing for the Aged

This programme provides assistance to elderly or prematurely aged people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness, on a low income, frail or generally at risk to access long-term secure and affordable housing.

Expanded service delivery

Nhulundu Health Service has been delivering aged care services for 20 years and we are continually expanding to meet the needs of our community. Our service delivery now includes Assistance with Care and Housing for Aged people living in Central Queensland-Fitzroy Aged Care Planning Region.

We can assist aged people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness to secure affordable housing. This is a free service to eligible clients. To determine eligibility or to access the programme you can self-refer, be referred through an agency, or phone 1800 468 000 (ask for Care and Housing).

Who is the programme for?

Aged people on low incomes who are experiencing difficulties accessing secure and affordable housing, care services and other related agencies.

Who is eligible?

- Must live in the Central Queensland-Fitzroy Aged Care Planning Region.
- Frail aged people 65 years and over or prematurely aged people* 50 years and over (or 45 years and over for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people), be on low income and who are homeless or at risk of homelessness.

* Prematurely aged people are those whose life course such as military service, homelessness or substance abuse, has seen them age prematurely.

What assistance can we provide to our clients?

The following services are available to eligible clients living in the Central Queensland-Fitzroy Aged Care Planning Region:

- Assist with referrals for people accessing housing services and related financial and legal services.
- Help with referrals for removal arrangements, settling in, or negotiating to improve accommodation.
- Assist with arranging services to help with daily living and health needs.
- Linking referrals to relevant local community supports to improve quality of life.
- Support with referral to other government departments.
- Assistance with referral for hoarding and squalor support.

All clients must be assessed by My Aged Care via the assessment services to determine eligibility and need to receive housing support or additional Commonwealth Home Support Programme services.
